

She is posed with a jeweled crown of old gold in her blond hair and holding a scepter and bouquet of daffodils. Miss Grobey is wearing the white velvet royal robe with a embroidered daffodil motif. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Grobey, Jr., she is the youngest of five children. One of the few golden haired queens selected in the festival's first 37 years, the blue-eyed high school senior is president of Mount Tahoma's choir, and member of the studio choir, Cleophas, Pep Club and Senior Girls Trio. Miss Grobey, 17, received her crown at Pacific Lutheran University's Olson Auditorium from Governor Dan Evans on April 6, 1970. (TNT 4-7-70, p. 1)





1971 Daffodil Festival Queen. Holding the symbols of her new office, Jean Fink of Lakes High School posed for her formal portrait as the 1971 Daffodil Festival Queen. The daughter of Lt. Col. and Mrs. Garvie S. Fink of Lakewood, she had attended schools in many states and had been at Lakes for 19 months. Miss Fink had a GPA of 3.97, the highest of the field of 14 princesses. She was crowned by Lt. Gov. John Cherberg on March 29, 1971, on the campus of Pacific Lutheran University. Jean Fink was Lakes' first queen. As befitting the daughter of a U.S. Air Force pilot, she flew a Cessna 150 as a hobby. Other achievements included appointment to the Bon Marche Fashion Board, member Junior Achievement, member of Lakes drill team and a Sunday School teacher. 

It is estimated that the street parade alone may be viewed by more than 2 million persons - on the street, live television, news clips and related media.

Hyacinths, narcissus and jonguils also are with us in abundance gracing huge fields, rockeries and homes alike only to give way shortly to tulips, iris, plums, crabs, cherries and myriads of others too numerous to mention.

This is Tacoma country in the Spring.










#### "What the World Needs Now" . . . . DAFFODILS

The Puyallup Valley Daffodil Festival is a kind of golden explosion that each spring stirs the blood of thousands of Western Washington residents and visitors alike. When the areas most popular locally-grown daffodils, King Alfred, burst forth in all their splendor, it seems to be the signal that everything and everyone is alive again.

Millions of these golden daffodils will be utilized to illustrate the theme and decorate the nearly forty floats in a Grand





Floral Street Parade (April 6), as well as boats in a Marine Parade and Regatta (April 7).

Marine events form an important part of the Daffodil Festival, because of the proximity of Puget Sound. The Floral Marine Parade, one of the few of its kind in the entire United States, may be viewed April 7 from vantage points along Tacoma's waterfront and will contain many decorated cruisers, outboards, and fishing craft. The viewing audience for this event is estimated to be approximately 50,000 people. That same day, yachtsmen will hold a Regatta on Tacoma's Commencement Bay with more than 40 entries in four separate classes. Visiting navy ships will add to the color of this event.

1976 Daffodil Festival Parade. The theme of the 43rd annual Grand Floral Parade was "America's 200 Years." Tacoma City Light traditionally built the non-competitive Queen's float for the Daffodil Festival Grand Floral Parade. Aboard the "Mayflower" on Saturday, April 10, 1976, was Daffodil Queen Renee Hopp of Rogers High School and her royal court escorted in the bright sunshine by yellow-clad Daffodilians. The 42-foot float was one-third the actual size of the original ship and was decorated with 10,000 yellow, short-stemmed daffodils. Since the ship's sails were folded, crowds lining the route could better see the parade's royalty. (TNT 4-10-1976, A-3-article)







Carol Glenn of Bethel High School was crowned the 1977 Daffodil Festival Queen in ceremonies held at Pacific Lutheran University on March 9, 1977. Miss Glenn, a senior, was the first top royalty selected from her school and the first African-American to receive that honor. There were a total of 18 princesses, each representing a public school in Pierce County. Miss Glenn, the daughter of retired Staff Sergeant and Mrs. Robert Glenn of Spanaway, was one of nine children. She planned to use the \$1000 college scholarship awarded to the queen to further her studies at Pacific Lutheran University. (TNT 3-10-77, A-1, 3)


